1. Introduction

This Cookie Policy explains how Bountiful Bridges uses cookies and similar technologies on our website.

By continuing to browse or use our website, you agree to the use of cookies as described in this policy, unless you choose to disable them.

We are committed to respecting your privacy and complying with the UK General Data Protection Regulation (UK GDPR) and the Privacy and Electronic Communications Regulations (PECR).

2. What Are Cookies?

Cookies are small text files placed on your device (computer, tablet, or mobile phone) when you visit a website.

They are widely used to make websites work efficiently, as well as to provide information to website owners.

Cookies do not give us access to your computer or any personal information other than what you choose to share.

3. How We Use Cookies

We use cookies to:

- Ensure the website functions properly
- Improve your browsing experience
- Understand how visitors use our website
- Help us improve content and services
- Remember user preferences (where applicable)

We do **not** use cookies to collect sensitive personal information or to identify individuals directly.

4. Types of Cookies We Use

4.1 Strictly Necessary Cookies

These cookies are essential for the website to function properly.

They enable core features such as:

- Page navigation
- Security and access control
- Form submissions (e.g. contact forms)

Without these cookies, the website may not function correctly.

4.2 Performance and Analytics Cookies

These cookies help us understand how visitors interact with the website.

They may collect information such as:

- Pages visited
- Time spent on pages
- Navigation patterns
- Device and browser type (anonymised where possible)

This data helps us improve the website and user experience.

4.3 Functionality Cookies

These cookies allow the website to remember choices you make, such as:

- Language preferences
- Form inputs
- Display settings

They enhance your experience but are not essential.

4.4 Marketing Cookies (If applicable)

If enabled in the future, these cookies may be used to:

- Deliver relevant content
- Measure engagement with campaigns
- Understand outreach effectiveness

At present, Bountiful Bridges does not actively use marketing cookies unless stated otherwise.

5. Third-Party Cookies

Some cookies may be placed by trusted third-party services that we use, such as:

- Website hosting providers
- Analytics tools (e.g. Google Analytics)
- Embedded content (e.g. YouTube videos or social media feeds)

These third parties may collect data in accordance with their own privacy policies.

We do not control third-party cookies, so we recommend reviewing their policies separately.
